Intervention Collaboration Meetings - Collaborating for Transfer Across Settings

Is your district having difficulty finding time for classroom teachers and interventionists to collaborate around student needs, monitoring of progress and alignment of language, content and practice? Are your intervention students transferring what they know and do across and between multiple settings? With this purpose in mind, the School District of Fort Atkinson has implemented Intervention Collaboration Meetings in elementary grades within the instructional day.

This session led by district coaches, principals, interventionists and classroom teachers, will highlight the importance of alignment between intervention and core, the power of professional collaboration for students and educators as well as transfer theory in the PCL model. Administrators, interventionists, and classroom teachers will learn how Fort Atkinson put this structure in place, view video clips and receive copies of protocols, forms and data resources.
